It is with sadness and thanksgiving that we the family of Catherine I. Pabst [nee Rudowski] announce her passing on Thursday, May 4, 2023 at the beautiful age of 102. The former Catherine Irene Rudowski was born on Thursday, May 12, 1921, in Buffalo New York to the late Samuel and Irene [Nowak] Rudowski. She lived in the Kaisertown section of Buffalo most of her life before moving in with her daughter Patricia in Amherst New York.

"Cath", as she was most often referred to attended Buffalo Public Schools and graduated from Niagara University School of Nursing. She had a long career working for Buffalo General Hospital and Sister's of Charity Hospital. She married Kenneth H. Pabst, formally of Cheektowaga, at the Church of St. Casimir on

Saturday, June 10, 1944. He predeceased her on Friday, December 2, 1994, after almost 51 years of marriage. They had three children; Richard K., Anne E. and Kenneth H. Richard passed away on April 2, 2005. Kenneth and Cath loved to bowl, go dancing at the Strand Ballroom, vacation in Hawaii, and above all else, spend time with the family cherishing every moment and making memories. She enjoyed baking and canning. Cath could almost always be found in her garden tending to her tulips in the Spring and roses in the Summer. There was always a fresh bouquet given out at each visit.
